

2026 Spring Vegetables

Artichoke (*Cynara cardunculus var. scolymus*) & Cardoon (*Cynara cardunculus*)



Imperial Star Artichoke

An early green artichoke specifically bred for annual production and summer harvest. Imperial Star doesn't require a chilling period for bud formation and will produce well-developed artichokes the first year from seed. This extra vigorous variety typically produces 1–2 primary buds, and 5–7 smaller secondary buds. 95 days.



Porto Spineless Cardoon

Multi-use edible perennial with similar flavor to artichoke when boiled (not for eating raw). Both portions are commonly used as a side vegetable, as an addition to stuffing, or in soups and stews. If left unharvested, the 3–4' tall plants will produce large, purple, thistle-like flowers. The sharply lobed and serrated silver-green leaves are a unique addition to flower arrangements. 100 days.

Asparagus (*Asparagus officinalis*)



Millennium

Superior all-around performer. Maintains tip tightness and produces more male plants, with higher fern vigor and survival. Does well in a variety of soil conditions, including heavy soils. Standard harvest 3 years after planting.

Beets (*Beta vulgaris*)



Bull's Blood

Heirloom variety produces deep burgundy leaves for salad or micro mix. Roots show attractive candy-striped zonation when sliced. 35 days baby leaf. 58 days roots.



Touchstone Gold

Excellent, sweet flavor and retains its golden color when cooked. Smooth, round roots with green petioles and leaves. 55 days.



Red Ace

Reliable, adaptable, and fast-maturing beet with strong tops. Sweet and tender, even when older. Medium-tall, red-veined greens for bunching. 50 days.

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Beets (*Beta vulgaris*)



Chioggia Guardsmark- NEW for 2026!

An heirloom Italian beet variety known for their striking pink and white concentric rings. Sweeter and milder in flavor. Delicious roasted, sautéed, pickled, or served raw in salads and carpaccio to showcase their unique appearance. 55 days.

Bok Choy (*Brassica rapa chinensis*)



Black Summer Choi

Broad, flat, light green petioles are topped with oval dark green leaves. Forms a perfect vase shape even when small. Nice compliment to 'Joi Choi'. Very slow bolting. 45 days.



Joi Choi

Heavy, vigorous white-stem Bok Choy. Broad, 12-15" tall, heavy bunch with dark green leaves and thick, flattened white petioles. 50 days

Broccoli (*Brassica oleracea italica*)



Green Magic

Boasts excellent heat tolerance. Heads are smooth, well-domed, and extremely uniform in maturity. Suited for summer harvest. 57 days.



Imperial

Heads are dark green with small, attractive beads. Best suited for harvest in summer and early fall and performs best in areas with long days and moderate heat. 66 days.



Broccoli Raab (Spring Rapini)

The most versatile broccoli raab variety for growing throughout the season. Especially well-suited for spring and summer harvest and overwintering in mild climates. Large, tender, abundant leaves are borne on thin stems with delicate buds. Small edible yellow flowers make an attractive garnish or addition to salads. 42 days.

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Broccoli (*Brassica oleracea italica*)



Di Ciccio

An Italian heirloom multi-cut variety said to be more productive than many hybrids. Its non-uniformity in maturity results in a longer harvest period, making it a good choice for succession planting in home gardens and market gardens alike. Plants produce small, 3–4" main heads projected well above the foliage followed by a large yield of side-shoot spears. 45 days.

Cabbage (*Brassica oleracea capitata*)



Primo Vantage

Mid-early variety. Medium-sized heads have a very short core, and the tender leaves are juicy, tender, and sweet. Great flavor for fresh use or light cooking. Perfect for coleslaw or stir-fries. 73 days.



Ruby Perfection


The No. 1 mid-late red cabbage. Medium size heads are dense, with uniform high-rounded shape. Good for late summer harvest and good field-holding ability. 85days.

Carrots (*Daucus carota var. sativus*)



Glow Stix Moonrise Mix -NEW for 2026!

A bold and striking mix! Well-matched maturity, size, and shape create a beautiful display of deep colors. Stronger tops for mechanical harvest and longer roots that will keep better in cold storage. 75 days.



Napoli

Early Nantes type with 7" long, bulky, semi-blunt roots and strong tops. Cylindrical, smooth, blunt roots with a sweet taste. 58 days.



Romance

Deep orange, blunt-tipped roots average 6-7" long. Excellent uniformity. High yielding plants with medium-size healthy tops. 65 days.

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Carrots (*Daucus carota var. sativus*)



Sugarsnax 54

Dark orange roots are smooth, sweet, and tender. 9–10" long roots are high in beta-carotene, an antioxidant and important source of vitamin A. 68 days.

Cauliflower (*Brassica oleracea botrytis*)



Snow Crown

Fast-growing and tolerant of a wide range of growing conditions. High quality, medium-size heads, and good tolerance to moderate fall frost. 50 days.



Romanesco

Strong, rugged plants with stunning high-quality heads that are perfect for summer harvest. Beautiful apple green whorls have a pleasing, nutty taste. Best served fresh but retains flavor and texture if lightly cooked. 80 days.

Celery (*Apium graveolens*)



Tango

Highly adaptable variety with great flavor and tender stalks. Performs well under less-than-ideal growing conditions, such as heat or moisture stress. 80 days.



Utah

Sturdy heirloom variety with thick, crisp dark green stalks reach one foot or more at maturity. Compact habit with nice aroma and a nutty flavor. 70-110 days.

Kale (*Brassica oleracea*)



Black Magic

Lacinato or “dinosaur” type kale. A well-maintained selection of ‘Toscano.’ Dark blue-green leaves with attractive savoy. Narrow leaves make tall, straight bunches. 65 days.

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Kale (*Brassica oleracea*)



Red Russian

Tender, colorful variety for salad mix. Stems are purple, leaves are deep gray-green, purple-veined, flat, non-curved and tooth-edged. Leaves are very tender. 25 days baby, 50 days mature.



Scarlet

Broad, purple frilly leaves. Darker color than 'Redbor.' Plant heights are not quite as uniform as other varieties, but an excellent choice for baby leaf or bunching. 30 days baby, 55 days mature.



Toscano

Lacinato or "dinosaur" type. Italian heirloom. Extra-dark green, non-curved but heavily savoyed leaves. Rich, tender leaves have a softer texture than curly green kales. Tolerant of both hot and cold weather. 30 days baby, 65 days mature.



Westlandse

USDA certified organic. Blue-green, curly leaves with vigorous production. 32 days baby, 60 days mature.



Winterbor

Ruffled, blue-green leaves have an attractive curl. Vigorous plants will continue growing to produce leaves for successive harvests. 60 days mature.



Dazzling Blue

Lacinato type featuring smoky blue leaves with a lilac midrib. Boasts excellent cold tolerance, with leaves sometimes displaying purple hues when exposed to cooler temperatures. Great for baby greens, fresh eating, or cooking. 30-60 days.

Leeks (*Allium porrum*) and *Allium* spp.



King Richard

Remarkable earliness and length up to a foot long to the first leaf. Upright, medium green leaves. For baby leeks, plant closely and harvest at finger size. 75 days.

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Lettuce (*Lactuca sativa*)

Green Butterhead/Bibb



Buttercrunch

Crisp and sweet. Forms a small, open but tightly bunched, 6" rosette with dark green leaves and small compact hearts that blanch to an appetizing yellow color. 28 days baby, 46 days full size.

Greenleaf



Tropicana

Best heat and bolt tolerance of green leaf types. Plants produce full heads with heavy, medium green leaves. Tolerant to tip burn. 52 days.

Green Oakleaf



Salad Bowl

Forms large, lime-green rosettes of delicate, lobed, oakleaf-like leaves. Good resistance to bolting and moderate heat tolerance. 1952 AAS winner. 28 days baby, 49 days full size.

Green Romaine



Green Forest

An early, tall, dark green, Paris Island type. Slow bolting, tolerant to tipburn, and has smooth ribs. Leaves are thick, crisp, juicy and sweet. 56 days.



Vivian – NEW for 2026!

a versatile, premium heirloom romaine lettuce variety known for blending the crispness of a traditional romaine with the tender, smooth texture of a butterhead. It is highly favored for its reliability and vigorous growth. 28 days baby, 50 days.

Widely adaptable gourmet salad mix created by Chef John Platt, of Boulder, Colorado. A feast for the eyes and the dinner table, this mix includes 'Lolla Rossa,' 'Black Seeded Simpson,' 'Summer Bibb', arugula, mizuna, and tatsoi. A good container mix. 20-45 days.

Red Butterhead



Marvel of the Four Seasons (Merveille des Quatre Saisons)- NEW!

Beautiful, heirloom French butterhead lettuce known for its ruby-red tipped leaves and sweet, tender green hearts, prized for growing almost year-round in many climates due to its tolerance for both cool weather and summer heat when given partial shade. 28 days baby, 45 days.

Redleaf



New Red Fire

Heavy, full heads with frilly leaves of deep red over green. Taste stays mild for a long time without bitterness. Slow bolting. 55 days.



Ruby Sky

Ruffled leaves are intense purple-red at the tips, and green at the inner base. Highly productive, with dense, heavy heads and good field holding. 58 days.

Red Oakleaf



Red Salad Bowl

Radiant burgundy red, deeply lobed, delicate oak-like leaves. Matures early, holds it mild, non-bitter salad quality a long time, and is slow to bolt. 28 days baby, 51 days full size.

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Lettuce (*Lactuca sativa*)

Red Romaine



Outredgeous

Outstanding, solid bright red leaves with ruffled edges. Full-sized heads are big, tall, and beautiful. Very flavorful. 28 days baby, 57 days full size.

Specialty Asian Greens (*Brassica spp.*)



Tendergreen (Komatsuna)

An heirloom variety known for its mild, spinach-like flavor with a hint of mustard, offering a tender texture, rapid growth, and heavy production yields. A resilient green, with cooler temperatures boosting the sweetness of its flavor profile. Leaves are very high in vitamins A and C, calcium, and iron. 45 days.



Red Giant

Big, bold, maroon leaves with lime veins are as delicious as they are ornamental in the garden or in a container. This traditional Asian green is faster growing and spicier than traditional southern mustards. Cold tolerant and bolt resistant.

Excellent pickled, wilted, or raw in salads, flavor intensifies in older leaves and hot weather, providing hints of horseradish. 45 days.

Peas (*Pisum sativum*)



Sugar Snap

Tender, sweet, crisp pods with vigorous plants producing a thick stand that requires support. Vines avg. 72" with 1 or 2 pods per node. Yields well over a long season in both hot and cold weather. 62 days.

Sorrel (*Rumex spp.*)



French Sorrel

Tender, fresh green leaves have an intense lemony flavor. Produces some of the earliest greens in spring and latest in fall. Use in salads, soups and sauces. Perennial. 35 days baby, 60 days full size.

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Sorrel (*Rumex spp.*)



Red Veined Sorrel

Bloody Sorrel. Bright green leaves with contrasting dark maroon stems and veins. Same tangy flavor as regular sorrel. Best when harvested young for baby salad mixes. 55 days.

Spinach (*Spinacia oleracea*)



Sunangel

Heavily savoyed DMR spinach for all seasons. A good balance of speed, dark color, savoy, and bolt tolerance for ample harvests through the whole year. Uniform and upright, with a more cupped leaf than traditional savoy varieties.



Hammerhead

Medium green, upright spinach with slightly elongated, round, cupped leaves. Like Emperor in leaf shape, but faster growing and more uniform, with a thicker, more savoyed, darker green leaf. 27 days.



Space

Medium dark green leaves are upright and smooth to slightly savoyed. Resistant to downy mildew and leaf spot. Tried and true variety. 25 days.



Equinox

Faster growing, slower bolting, and much more uniform than Bloomsdale. Upright plants with fully savoyed leaves on long stems. 29 days.



Seaside

Upright, dark green leaves, that are somewhat spade shaped. Stays small, which extends the baby leaf harvest window. 30 days.



Red Malabar

Heat loving salad and stir-fry green. Vigorous climbing vines grow through summer into fall. Glossy, thick, savoyed leaves resemble spinach. Dark green leaves and deep red/purple stems. Mild Swiss chard taste. Use leaves and young stems sparingly in salads or stir-fries. 50 baby; 85 full size.

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Swiss Chard (*Beta vulgaris cicla*)



Bright Lights

Stems of many colors including gold, pink, orange, purple, red, and white. Lightly savoyed, green or bronze leaves. Mild tasting. 28 days baby, 55 days bunching.



Firebird

Dark red leaves and petioles. Strikingly beautiful fully red, glossy, savoyed leaves. Suited for both baby leaf and bunching production. 32 days baby; 60 days bunching.



Ruby Red

Candy-apple red stems with dark green, red-veined leaves. Excellent as a true red color in salad mixes. Tender with good flavor. 32 days baby, 59 days bunching.
